New Life in Christ (Ephesians 4:17-24)

Intro: Sam says that he was saved a long time ago, but his life never really changed. He tells his wife that no one is perfect, and people need to just "lighten up and give me a break". Does the Bible have anything to say to people like Sam?

1. Admonition: You've got to CHANGE! vs. 17-19

Don't live like the unbelievers!

- **THINK** differently. (vs. 17-18)
 - not in futility
 - not in darkness
 - not in ignorance
 - not in hardness and callousness of heart
- **BEHAVE** differently. (v. 19)
 - not in sensuality
 - not in impurity
 - not in greediness

2. Argument: Consider this!

vs. 20-24

If you're really a Christian...

You have <mark>LAID ASIDE</mark> the old self. (v. 22) You've been <mark>RENEWED</mark> unto true knowledge. (v. 23) You've <mark>PUT ON</mark> the new self. (v. 24)

Salvation is deliverance from sin…its PENALTY, but also its PREFERENCE and its POWER and its PRACTICE.

1 John 3:9 "No one who is born of God practices sin..."

New Life in Christ (CONNECT questions for 4/14) --Read Ephesians 4:17-24

1. Consider 2 Cor. 5:17 *"Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away. Behold, new things have come."* What if the old things haven't really passed away, and new things are slow in coming? **Is there such a thing as a "carnal Christian"?** Refer to 1 Cor. 3:3 and Rom. 8:7. (note: carnal= Gr. *sarkinos*= of the flesh; natural or unempowered man)

If your answer is yes, how would you describe such a person?

If your answer is no, how would you describe such a person?

2. Consider Mark 1:15 *"repent, and believe in the gospel."* How do you know if someone (including yourself) is really born again?
